## Page 1

#### **Materials**

<sup>2</sup>/<sub>3</sub> yard Pool Floaties - Blue (A) 1004-75
 1 ½ yards Umbrella Geometric - Light Gray (B) 1005-90
 1 ½ yards Pool Scenic - Light Blue (Backing) 1001-70

#### You will also need:

- 5/8 yard of fusible stabilizer
- Wash out pencil

## **Cutting Instructions**

Please note: all strips are cut across the width of fabric (WOF) from selvage to selvage edge unless otherwise noted.

## From Pool Floaties - Blue (A), cut:

• (2) 9 ½"x WOF strips. Sub-cut (4) 9 ½" x 18 ½" strips.

## From the Umbrella Geometric - Light Gray (B), cut:

• (1) 18 ½" x 48 ½" Length of Fabric (LOF) strip.

### From the Pool Scenic - Light Blue (Back), cut:

• (1) 18 ½" x 48 ½" LOF strip.

### From the Fusible Stabilizer, cut:

• (1) 18 ½" x 48 ½" LOF strip.

#### **Assembly**

1. Place (2) 9 ½" x 18 ½" Fabric A rectangles, right sides together. Sew across (1) long side (Fig. 1). Fold the sewn

fabric in half along the sewn edge, the two pieces are wrong sides together and press to make (1) Pocket Unit. Repeat to make (2) Pocket Units total.



2. Place (1) 18 ½" x 48 ½" Fabric B piece on a flat surface. Position and pin in place (1) Pocket Unit on the left side, aligning the raw edges, with the sewn edge towards the center. Using 1/8" seam allowance sew the pocket in place along the short sides and across the bottom (Fig. 2). Repeat to add the second Pocket Unit to the right side to make the Pouch Front.




- 3. Following the manufacturer's instructions, press the 18 ½" x 48 ½" fusible stabilizer to the wrong side of the Pouch Front.
- 4. Place the Pouch Front and the 18 ½" x 48 ½" Fabric C strip,

right sides together. Sew the two pieced together, leaving a 3" to 4" opening for turning (Fig. 3).

- 5. Turn the Pool Pouch right side out through the opening and press. Top stitch around the Pouch to close the opening and finish the edges.
- 6. Following Figure 4. Measure and mark the lines on each pocket unit to divide the large pocket.
- 7. Using a walking foot, sew on the drawn lines to complete the pockets on each end of the pouch.



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
