Fabrics A, cut:

(2) Template One units

(2) Template Four units

Fabric B, cut:

(2) Template One units

(2) Template Four units

Fabric C, cut:

(2) Template Two units

Fabric D, cut:

(4) Template Three units

Fabric E, cut:

(2) Template Two units

Fabric J. cut:

(4) each, Templates 5-10

Backing, cut:

(2) 13" x 18 ½" (33.02cm x 47cm)

Pillow Two Cutting Instructions

Fabrics F, cut:

(4) Template Two units

Fabric G, cut:

(4) Template Three units

Fabric H, cut:

(4) Template Four units

Fabric I, cut:

(4) Template One units

Fabric J, cut:

(4) each, Templates 5-10

Backing, cut:

(2) 13" x 18 ½" (33.02cm x 47cm)

#### **Piecing Instructions:**

The final 16 point star block is made from first creating a quadrant of the block using each of the templates 1-10. The Template edges are marked with notes to help you orient the pieces in the correct direction in relation to one another. The \* marked on each piece indicates the point that is closest to the center of the final star.

1. Using  $\frac{1}{4}$ " (0.64cm) seam allowances, join the sections of the quadrant in the order as shown in Figure 1.



- 2. Sew piece 10 to piece 1, then piece 1 to piece 9, press seam allowances toward 10 and 9 to make section A.
- 3. Sew piece 3 to piece 7, then both to piece 8, press seam allowances towards 8 and 7 to make section B.
- 4. Sew piece 4 to piece 5, then both to piece 6, press seam allowances towards 6 and 5 to make section C.
- 5. Sew section B to section C, press seam allowances towards section C.
- 6. Sew piece 2 to the section created in the previous step, press seam allowances away from section A.
- 7. Repeat all of the sewing steps above 3 more times to create the four quadrants of the star.
- 8. Each pieced quadrant of the final square should measure 9  $\frac{1}{2}$ " (24.13cm). Using a straight edge make sure that each of the four quadrants is square and are the same size as one another.

9. Align two of the sewn quadrants together, so the center edges are aligned, right sides together. Sew the two sections together and press open (Fig. 2).



- 10. Repeat Step 9 with the remaining two quadrants.
- 11. Sew the two sections together, making sure they're center edges are aligned to make the pillow top. Press the seams open.

#### **Pillow Assembly:**

- 12. To make the back envelope flaps, turn under the  $18 \ \frac{1}{2}$ " (47cm) edge on one 13" x  $18 \ \frac{1}{2}$ " (33.02cm x 46.99cm) Backing strip, approximately  $\frac{1}{4}$ ", press and repeat. Top stitch the folded fabric in place to make one flap. Repeat with the second 13" x  $18 \ \frac{1}{2}$ " (33.02cm x 46.99cm) strip to make another flap.
- 13. Position and pin the each back envelope flap, right sides together with the pillow front, overlapping the finished edges in the middle and aligning the raw edges with the pillow front (Fig. 3). Stitch around the pillow front and back using a zipper foot. Turn the pillow right side out.




- 14. Slide in the pillow foam to complete.
- 15. Repeat to make the second pillow.





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
