Sew It Yourself

The following project was created with fabric that your local retailer may no longer have available. You can recreate these projects by replacing the fabrics shown using the fabric key as a guide for similar colorations or styles.

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Free Spiril

Scarf

Skill level – Beginner/Easy

The fun and beauty of quilting and sewing is to take a project and make it your own with the fabric of your choice. While this collection may no longer be available we encourage you to find fabrics you like and make it your own.

Materials

To make a soft neck scarf with a cosy and silky feel you will need 96 cm of a 100% Cotton Voile.

3 skeins of Cotton Embroidery Thread Art.

Polyester sewing thread.

A square piece of carton size 5×5 cm.

Additional Requirements

Measure tape, scissors, a piece of card board, an embroidery needle and a sewing needle, an iron, a sewing machine.

Cotton Voile Scarf

Instructions

Cut a square piece of fabric size 96 x96 cm. Fold a seam 0.3 cm on the wrong side on all sides of the scarf, iron flat, fold again 0,3 cm and iron flat again. Topstitch the seam with a sewing machine.

Use the Cotton yarn to make 20 tassels. Follow the how to make the tassels instructions below.

Use the sewing thread and needle to fix a tassel onto each corner of the scarf on the wrong side close to the edge. Dispose the other 16 tassels evenly on all four sides of the scarf and sew on accordingly.

How to make the tassels:

Step 1

Cut a square piece of carton size 5×5 cm, cut a little slit at the bottom to pinch the beginning of the thread.

Step 2

Wrap the yarn 15 times around the carton, pinch end and cut. Thread the embroidery needle with 10 cm of the same yarn and pull under the threads at the top of the carton. Slide the yarn bundle carefully off the carton.


Step 3

Put a solid double knot at the top to hold the fabric bundle. Form a loop sized 1.5 cm and put another solid double knot. Cut thread ends short.

Step 4

Make the tassel head by wrapping yarn 5 - 6 times around the yarn bundle. The head should be about 1 cm long. Put a solid double knot to the thread ends and cut ends short. Cut the threads at the bottom to open the tassel and cut all threads even.

You do not need to hide knots or thread ends, this will give the tassels a modern look.



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
