## Fun Infinity Scarf

Skill level - Beginner/Easy

Fabric by Tula Pink

Technique:	Straight Stitch
Brand:	FreeSpirit Fabrics
Crafting time:	Evening

From the yardage given you will be able to make four Infinity Scarves in approximately four hours. Instructions will walk you through making one scarf.

### Supplies

2 1/2 yards (2.3m) of dark voile – FreeSpirit Tula Pink VTP02.INDIG by Tula Pink  
1 yard (.91m) of medium colored voile – FreeSpirit Tula Pink VTP03.INDIG by Tula Pink  
1 yard (.91m) of light colored voile – FreeSpirit Tula Pink VTP01.AQUAX by Tula Pink  
Coordinating Coats & Clark Dual Duty XP® all-purpose thread  
Pins  
Iron  
Rotary cutter, mat, ruler,  
Marking pen or chalk pencil

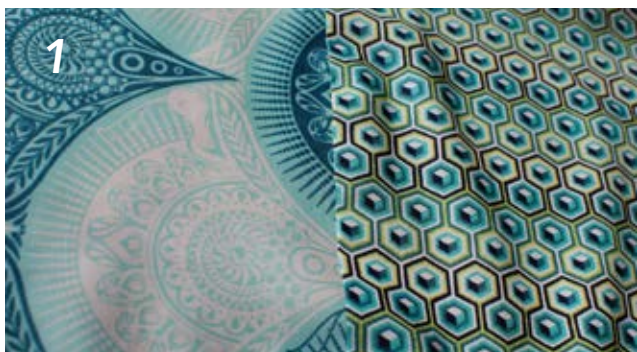

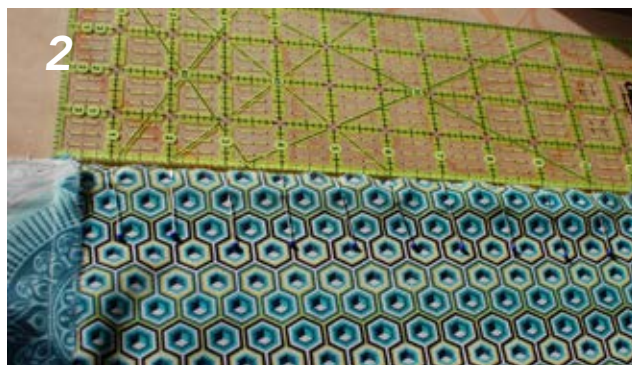
## Instructions

Seam allowance is 3/8" (2.34cm) unless noted.

1. From your dark fabric cut a strip along the selvedge measuring 13" x 64" (33.2cm x 1.63m). From your medium colored fabric cut a strip 13" x 23 1/2" (33.2cm x 59.69cm). From your light color fabric cut a strip 13" x 30" (33.2cm x 76.2cm) and another 13" x 14" (33.2cm x 35.56cm).
2. With your strips right sides together matching short edges sew one light strip to one end of the medium strip. Sew the other light strip to the remaining medium short edge creating one long strip. Press the seams toward the medium strip. (image 1)



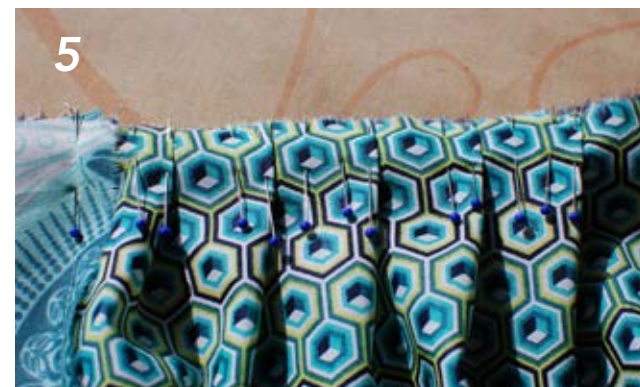
3. On the wrong side of the scarf, starting at one of the seams where the medium and light fabrics meet, mark every inch on the medium fabric for 10" (25.4cm) toward the center of the scarf. Add a pin at each mark. (image 2)



4. Pinch the first pin and move it toward the second pin to create a pleat. (image 3)(image 4)



5. Pinch the third pin and move towards the fourth pin. Move the fifth to the sixth and so on until you have created 5 pleats. Repeat for the other side of the scarf, directly below the first set of pleats. (image 5)



### Pro Tip:

Using a 5.0 stitch length on your machine, baste pleats down to temporarily hold them in place.

6. Pin the medium/light strip to the right side of the dark fabric strip along one long edge matching raw edges. Sew along the edge making sure to catch the pleats and hold them in place. (image 6).



7. Press the seam toward the dark fabric. Topstitch along the seam. (image 7)



8. With the scarf right sides together again, stitch the remaining long sides of the scarf strips together. This will create a long tube. Turn the scarf right side out and press the seam.
9. To close the scarf, line up single layers of short ends with right sides together, side seams aligned, and raw edges matching. (image 8)



10. Turn the seam right side out and press. You will have a small opening remaining to hand sew closed. (image 9)
