Additional Recommendations

- 100% cotton thread in colors to match
- 75" x 75" (1.91m x 1.91m) batting
- Template plastic, optional
- 12½" or larger square ruler, optional






Preparation

Print triangle template pattern (page 7), making sure to print at (100%). Measure the one inch test print square to confirm the printed size is correct before cutting fabric. To make a template from template plastic, place the printed paper template pattern underneath the template plastic and trace the template shape. Cut out the template shape along the solid outer line.

Notes:

To make the most efficient use of fabric, rotate every other Template A
Triangle when cutting triangles from the WOF or LOF strips (Fig. 1).



Rotate the template 180° to make the most efficient use of fabric when cutting triangles.

 Template placement on striped prints creates different effects in the finished quilt block. For Fabrics C and L, rotating the triangle switches the stripe color at the tip and base (Fig. 2).

Template placement on striped prints creates different effects in the finished quilt block. For **Fabrics C** and **L**, rotating the triangle puts a different stripe at the tip.

• Group and label cut triangles with fabric letter identifier for easier assembly.

Cutting

WOF = Width of Fabric; LOF = Length of Fabric

Fabric A, cut:

- (8) 4" x WOF for borders
- (2) 6½" x WOF; subcut
 - (24) Template A triangles

Fabric B, cut:

- (7) 21/2" x WOF for binding
- (3) 4%" x WOF; subcut (24) 4%" squares, then cut each square once diagonally, from corner to corner, to create 48 corner triangles

Fabric C, cut:

- (4) 61/2" x LOF; subcut
 - (24) Template A triangles (Note: if you wish to have all blocks with the same color at the tip of the triangles as in the sewn sample, do NOT rotate every other template. There is enough yardage allowed for this effect.)

Fabrics D and E, cut from each:

(2) 6½" x WOF; subcut (24) Template A triangles

Fabrics F, G, H, and I, cut from each:

(2) 6½" x WOF; subcut (20) Template A triangles

Fabric J, cut:

- (3) 4%" x WOF; subcut
 - (26) 4%" squares, then cut each square once diagonally, from corner to corner, to create 52 corner triangles



Fabric K, fussy cut:

- (1) 61/2" x WOF; subcut
 - (6) Template A triangles, centering the triangle vertically on the large purple diamonds on top of the green shapes, as shown (**Fig. 3**).

From remaining yardage, cut

(6) Template A triangles, rotating the template 90°, and centering it vertically on the dark blue stripe with the pairs of light blue ovals, as shown (**Fig. 3**).

Fabric L, cut:

(4) 6½" x LOF; subcut (12) Template A triangles

Instructions

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Note: All seam allowances are ½" (.64cm) unless otherwise noted. Sew pieces right sides together. Press seam allowances open unless otherwise indicated.

 Sew (1) Fabric E triangle to (1) Fabric D triangle as shown (Fig. 4). Press. Make (4) D/E triangle pairs.



2. Sew (2) triangle pairs from step 1 together as shown (**Fig. 5**). Make two sets of joined pairs. Press.






3. Sew the sets of joined pairs together along the long straight edge to complete a **D/E** Block Center (**Fig. 6**). Press.


4. Refer to the table below and repeat steps 1-3 to make the following quantities of Block Centers.

5. Rotate one D/E Block Center so the triangles are oriented as shown, then sew the long edge of a Fabric J triangle, centered, to each base of the Fabric E triangles to complete a Kaleidoscope block (Fig. 7). Press. Trim to $12\frac{1}{2}$ " x $12\frac{1}{2}$ " to square up.

Kaleidoscope Block


6. Referring to Fig. 8 for corner triangle fabrics and Block Center orientation, add Fabric J and B corner triangles to the remaining Block Centers to complete a total of 25 Kaleidoscope blocks.

Quilt Top Assembly

Measure the Quilt Center width and height before cutting and adding borders and adjust border measurements if necessary to match your measurements.


- 7. Referring to the **Quilt Layout** diagram on page 6, arrange the blocks in (5) rows of (5) blocks each. Sew the blocks in each row together along adjacent edges. Press all the seam allowances in each row in the same direction, and alternate direction from row to row so seams will nest.
- 8. Sew the rows together along adjacent edges, nesting seam allowances, to complete the quilt center. Press all the seam allowances in the same direction.
- 9. Sew the 4" x WOF Fabric A border strips together in pairs at the short ends, making sure the butterflies in each strip have the same orientation. Press. Trim down into (2) top/bottom borders, 4" x 671/2", and (2) side borders, 4" x 601/2".
- 10. Sew a side border to the left and right sides of the guilt center. Press the seam allowances toward the borders. Sew one top/bottom border to the upper edge, and the other to the lower edge of the guilt center to complete the guilt top. Press the seam allowances toward the borders.




Finishing

- **11.** Sew together the 2½" **Fabric B** binding strips end-to-end using diagonal seams. Press seams open. Press the binding strip in half wrong sides together.
- **12.** Layer backing (wrong side up), batting, and quilt top (right side up). Baste the layers together and quilt as desired. Trim excess batting and backing even with the top after quilting is completed.
- 13. Leaving an 8" tail of binding, sew the binding to the top of the quilt through all layers matching all raw edges. Miter corners. Stop approximately 12" from where you started. Lay both loose ends of binding flat along quilt edge. Where the loose ends meet, fold them back on themselves and press to form a crease. Using this crease as your stitching line, sew the two open ends of the binding right sides together. Trim seam to ¼" and press open. Finish sewing binding to quilt.
- **14.** Turn the binding to the back of quilt and hand-stitch in place.
